- British, French and Israeli troops move on Suez Canal.
- Hungarian Revolution begins and up-rising quelled by Soviets.
- Prince Rainier of Monaco marries film actress Grace Kelly.
- John Lennon & Paul McCartney meet for the 1<sup>st</sup> time as rock group The Quarrymen perform at a church dinner.
- In North Africa, Morocco wins its independence from French colonial rule.
- Fidel Castro lands on the Eastern coast of Cuba, launching a revolution against the Batista regime.
- Moscow normalizes relations with Japan.
- The U.S. explodes the first airborne hydrogen bomb over Bikini Atoll
- Japan launches the world's largest oil tanker; 780 feet long, weighing 84,730 tons.
- · Suez Crisis begins.
- Khrushchev denounces Stalin
- The first transatlantic telephone cable goes into operation.
- In Melbourne Australia, the XVI<sup>th</sup> Summer Olympic Games open.

### **NATIONAL NEWS of the YEAR 1956**

- Supreme Court ruling outlaws racial segregation in intrastate public transportation.
- Dwight Eisenhower is re-elected President, defeating Democrat Adlai Stevenson for the second time.
- Martin Luther King organizes a boycott of Montgomery, Alabama public busses.
- In Boston, the Brinks robbery gang is brought to justice.
- Congress authorizes private atomic energy plants.
- Thomas Watson, founder of IBM, passed away.
- The Federal Interstate Highway System act signed.
- · Velcro was invented.
- T.V. Remote Control invented.
- A Super Constellation and a DC-7, which had left L.A. three minutes apart, collided and crashed into the Grand Canyon, killing 130.
- The Ampex Corporation demonstrates the first commercial videotape recorder.
- Many school districts in the south defied the Supreme Court ruling that segregation in public schools was unconstitutional. Many schools were closed down when federal funding was cut off for non-compliance.
- The United States Army gets an official flag
- The U.S. steel strike starts affecting the nation; rail lines are forced to lay off 30,000.
- In L.A. two commuter trains derail, killing 30 people and injuring another 140.
- In Ohio, the Columbus Zoo reports first gorilla born in captivity
- Elvis Presley skyrocketed to fame with "Heartbreak Hotel", "Don't Be Cruel", "Hound Dog" And "Love Me Tender". Presley's appearance on the Ed Sullivan Show brought TV its highest viewer numbers to date.
- Actress Grace Kelly married Prince Rainer II of Monaco, renouncing her U.S. citizenship to take the title of Princess.
- o The Coasters sign with Atlantic Records.
- NBC-TV gave tonight host Steve Allen his first of many prime-time variety shows.
- The top-grossing film was "The Ten Commandments", starring Charlton Heston
- "My Fair Lady" began its seven-year run on Broadway.
- The United States Post Office installs electric stamp sellers.


