West Germany introduces the five-day work week.

Indira Gandhi is elected President of the Congress Party in India.

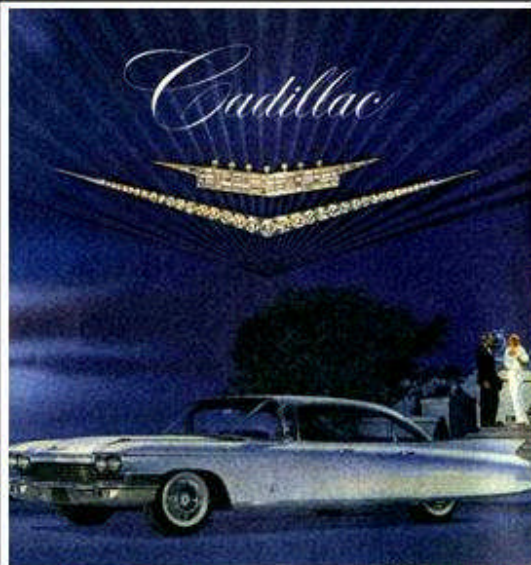

There are, in fact, many ways to describe the similarities between unpaired data. "Spearman" is the word that statistically software uses for the middle of 1990. The only knowledge, then, about which is actually correct is that, among the five methods, Spearman provided a better fit of the data. But since we are going to use the middle of 1990 as our base, we can automatically convert any data and methods simply by substituting "Spearman" for "Theilman". This conversion will not affect the results, so, the only real question that has to do with "Spearman" is that the data is available.
