

# TAFT HIGH SCHOOL Class of June 1959 50th Anniversary Celebration

Returning 50th reunion questionnaires included a surprising number of unsolicited comments about teachers. James J. Stamm was the teacher they mentioned most often. Many indicated that he was tough, a perfectionist, but got more out of his students than they thought they had to give. James J. Stamm was affectionately known to many of his students as "JJ", So we contacted J.J., (now retired in Sarasota, FL), to see if he would be interested in attending our 50th Anniversary Reunion Celebration. The answer was an enthusiastic YES!



The Taft Girls & Mixed Choruses' under the direction of J. J. Stamm won more Chicago City Choral Competitions than any high school during his tenure as the Taft Music Director. For over 25 years there simply was no competitor that even came close. The winning formula was simple as 1-2-3 . . . (but that's where "simple" ended)

1. JJ selected songs that had a high 'degree of difficulty, and he did so with confidence that his students would meet the challenge.

2. The complexity of his musical arrangements was always of professional quality.

3. The practice regimen he required resulted in a precision execution by his students and were unequaled by any competitor. As stated by Chicago Sun-Times music critic attending one of the competitions, "It was hard to believe the Taft Girls & Mixed Choruses' programs was performed by high school students".
